

Walcha Dairy

Niangala students visited the Walcha Dairy on Tuesday 16 March. A huge thank you to managers Nick and Elly for their very informative tour of the dairy and taking the time to answer the questions put to them by our students.



Sophie—The dairy has 800 cows that they

have to milk twice a day. They milk the cows at 3.00 am and 2.00 pm. Each cow there on average produces 23 litres of milk each milking session.

Benji—I asked how many bulls do you need for your dairy herd, which was 25-26 bulls and where does your milk go to? Monday to Friday Brisbane and Saturday to Sunday was Sydney.

Chaise—We went to see the dairy cows get milked and eighty cows could get milked at a time. There was this spraying water that sprayed the cows so they didn't get the bug.

Eddie—My question was How much is a full vat of milk roughly worth? It is worth \$12 000 to \$13 000.

Valerie—There were 800 dairy cows and lots of calves. One of the calves is only 3 days old.








Walcha Central School Taster Day

Easter Baking—Rocky Road Fudge

Ingredients—

2 x 180g white chocolate, chopped

2 x 395g cans condensed milk

130g packet honey and sea salt roasted peanuts

1/2 x 280g packet marshmallow noodles, cut into 2cm lengths 350g block milk chocolate, chopped

Method

step 1—Grease an 18cm x 28cm slice pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 2cm above edges of pan

step 2—Place white chocolate and half the condensed milk in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on HIGH for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Add peanuts and marshmallow. Stir to combine. Pour mixture into prepared pan. Smooth surface. Refrigerate.

Step 3—Meanwhile, place remaining condensed milk and the milk chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on HIGH for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Carefully spoon mixture over white chocolate layer and gently smooth surface. Refrigerate for 4 hours or until firm.

In the Garden

Our students, Mrs Harris and Pete had a lovely time on Friday afternoon planting their seed boxes from Woolworths.

They planted a variety of vegetables, herbs and flowers—ranging from



spinach, cabbage and salad leaves to chives, thyme, and lemon balm. The phlox, cornflowers and poppies will be beneficial for attracting bees to the vegetable garden.

The children eagerly check out the germination progress each day when they arrive at school.
